This list is not exhaustive and represents only a selection of possible indicators.

Common Work and Living Conditions: The Individual(s) in Question

- Is not free to leave or come and go as he/she wishes
- Is under 18 and is providing commercial sex acts
- Is in the commercial sex industry and has a pimp / manager
- Is unpaid, paid very little, or paid only through tips
- Works excessively long and/or unusual hours
- Is not allowed breaks or suffers under unusual restrictions at work
- Owes a large debt and is unable to pay it off
- Was recruited through false promises concerning the nature and conditions of his/her work
- High security measures exist in the work and/or living locations (e.g. opaque windows, boarded up windows, bars on windows, barbed wire, security cameras, etc.)

Poor Mental Health or Abnormal Behavior

- Is fearful, anxious, depressed, submissive, tense, or nervous/paranoid
- Exhibits unusually fearful or anxious behavior after bringing up law enforcement
- Avoids eye contact

Poor Physical Health

- Lacks health care
- Appears malnourished
- Shows signs of physical and/or sexual abuse, physical restraint, confinement, or torture

Lack of Control

- Has few or no personal possessions
- Is not in control of his/her own money, no financial records, or bank account
- Is not in control of his/her own identification documents (ID or passport)
- Is not allowed or able to speak for themselves (a third party may insist on being present and/or translating)

Other

- Claims of just visiting and inability to clarify where he/she is staying/address
- Lack of knowledge of whereabouts and/or do not know what city he/she is in
- Loss of sense of time
- Has numerous inconsistencies in his/her story

- Be alert and available to those who may be victims.

These are given to those rescued, as well as juveniles in local shelters and juvenile hall, as these youth have been victimized or are vulnerable to victimization
- If you feel that discipleship is an area you are being called to serve in, consider joining in weekly bible studies, as well helping plan and organize monthly activities with the girls served by Faith.Hope.Love
- If you are a youth leader, group home rep, school administrator, foster care agency, invite FHL to lead a workshop to educate your staff and or clients/students regarding domestic minor trafficking awareness and prevention.
- Get involved in letter writing campaigns for girls found in juvenile hall, group homes, and the foster care system. If you are interested in hosting an event or obtaining more information contact FHL.

- Foster current foster youth or emancipated youth. FTFFA is looking for parents willing to provide a short term or long term home, love and support to children in the child welfare system (all ages, including after emancipation at 18 years of age), and the probation department.
